Greetings Hamburg,

The Ides of March is upon us as well as St. Patrick's Day. The unseasonal weather has seen our streets busy with people walking and biking. When operating your motorized vehicle in town, please be observant of those on foot or a bike.

City Council meet this week. The Council approved a Resolution that set the parameters and timeline for street work on Brad Street. Due to the process of obtaining bids for Brad Street project, the City Council moved the April meeting from the 9th to the 16th at 7 pm. On April 16th, the City Council will award the project. The bid process will open on April 11th.

Commissioner Fahey updated the City Council and Staff on several projects taking place in the county. At some point this year, County Road 50 will have road work (sealcoat) done within city limits. The Council and Staff asked Commissioner Fahey to give us a heads up when its set to take place. Chief Siewert presented the Annual Township Report.

The Deeds for the Trebesch Litigation were set, and the Council approved me to sign the Quit Claim Deed. The Quit Claim Deed was signed on Wednesday and delivered to our attorney's for filing on Thursday. Once the County completes their end of the process, we will be done with subdivision and the litigation.

On March 22nd the Hamburg Lions will have their Spring Bingo at the Community Hall. Doors open at 5 pm and the first ball will drop at 6:30 pm. The West Carver Gril Scouts will host an Easter Egg Hunt on March 23rd. The Easter Egg Hunt will be at the Legion/Pool Park on Reform Street in NYA. On Sunday March 24th, Know It All's will have breakfast skilletts and cinnamon roll muffins available start at 9 am. Later in the day, polka music will be played by Da Dutchman starting at 1 pm.
