Hope everyone is doing well and being safe. Mother Nature started our week out with summer and ended it with fall. Thanks to everyone that gave feedback on the City-Wide Garage Sales. Based on the feedback, the plan will be to keep it in June.

At our last City Council meeting, we approved a liquor license for Know It All's Bar & amp; Grill LLC. We will be closing applications for the seasonal help position at the end of April with the goal of getting some hired in the first part of May. At next meeting, in May, we will have a public hearing for a variance request for 480 Henrietta Avenue. The public hearing will take place at 7 pm with the City Council meeting to follow. Other items approved at our last Council meeting was a 3-year contract with Clark Environmental Mosquito Management Program and a Joint Powers Agreement with the State of Minnesota.
