Carver County Commissioner passed a Resolution to re-district the five Commissioner Districts. Resolution 34-22 defined District 5 as: Benton Township, Camden Township, Carver, Cologne, Dahlgren Township, Hamburg, Hancock Township, New Germany, Norwood Young America, San Francisco Township, and Young America Township. We were in District 5 and will remain in District 5.

The Personnel Committee met this week to discuss updates to our Employee Handbook. Majority of the updates were to bring the Handbook into compliance with new employee laws passed over the past ten years. Updates will be discussed and potentially approved at the next City Council meeting in May.
