The city shall provide, upon request, an itemized statement of the various costs incurred by the city. The city may deny final action on a land use application and/or rescind prior action until all Fees are paid; unless the provisions of Minn. Stat. 462.353 subd. 4(d) are utilized and the deposit contemplated therein is made. The city may require additional deposits, if deemed necessary.

**PROPERTY ENTRY**. The Property Owner and Applicant agrees to allow city staff, commission members and council members access to the property, at reasonable times after reasonable notice to the Property Owner and Applicant by mail, email or verbal notification. Notice shall be provided at least 48 hours before desired entry. Any entry onto the Property is for the limited purpose of viewing the Property related to the Application made herein.

When evaluating the capacity of the Hamburg Wastewater Treatment Facility (WWTF) it is important to determine the following:

- Total capacity of the system (both hydraulic and organic).
- Capacity currently being used (calculated using daily monitoring report [DMR] data).
- Capacity remaining for future growth (both hydraulic and organic).

#### **EFFLUENT LIMITS**

The Hamburg WWTF is a stabilization pond system that consists of two primary ponds and one secondary pond. The facility operates under NPDES/SDS Permit MN0025585 that expired on July 31, 2015. Each primary pond is 2.75 acres and the secondary pond is 3.33 acres. The pond facility was designed for an average wet weather flow of 63,000 gpd. The limits for the Hamburg facility are shown in the table below.

### TOTAL CAPACITY OF POND SYSTEM

To determine the total capacity of the system both organic loading rate and storage must be evaluated. In Minnesota the recommended design loading rate for a stabilization pond system is 22 lb cBOD/acre/day in the primary ponds and the storage capacity required in Southern Minnesota is 180 days in the entire pond system. Based on these criteria the pond system has a total capacity as shown in the table below.

#### **CURRENT CAPACITY USED**

The DMR data from January 2017 – August 2020 was used to determine the average wet weather flow during the 180 wettest days during a May-October or November-April timeframe according to MPCA guidelines. The wettest 180 day timeframe was November 2018 – April 2019 and based on the average flow from this period and the average load data for all cBOD, TSS, and TP samples, the amount of hydraulic and load capacity currently being used at the Hamburg WWTF is shown in the table below.

#### REMAINING POND CAPACITY

The remaining pond capacity is calculated by subtracting the capacity currently being used at the WWTF from the total pond capacity. Both organic load capacity and storage capacity must be considered to determine the limiting factor for remaining capacity. Both the remaining organic load and storage capacities have been equated to Residential Equivalent Units (REUs). One REU is equivalent to one household and the Minnesota State Demographer has estimated 2.51 persons per household for the City of Hamburg.

Please note that the results in Table 4 are based on MPCA Guidelines for determining the Average Wet Weather (AWW) flow based on the wettest 180 days using precipitation data. However, the wettest 180 days based on precipitation does not necessarily correlate to the highest average flowrates due to variations in wet weather events, such as the time for the recorded amount of precipitation each day to fall. Those variations can directly impact inflow and infiltration at the WWTF. When adding more data from 2015 and 2016 and reviewing the historical average flowrates for the May-October and November-April timeframes, the maximum average flow regardless of precipitation amounts is 0.053 MGD which occurred in May-October 2019. This is higher than the AWW flow calculated using MPCA Guidelines of 0.043 MGD (see in Table 3). While this doesn't impact the organic load capacity significantly, it does impact the hydraulic capacity by reducing the storage available. The results of the remaining capacity using the maximum average flow is shown in Table 5 below.

### CONCLUSION

While the pond system has organic load capacity for future growth of 122 REUs, the limiting factor for the capacity of the Hamburg WWTF is the storage volume. At average flow and load conditions the pond system has capacity for an additional 82 REUs and at maximum average flow and load conditions the pond system has capacity for an additional 43 REUs. Because the storage capacity is based on flow, reduction of I&I to the pond system may help gain additional REUs.

# AMENDMENT TO PROFESSIONAL SERVICE AGREEMENT Contract for Police Services

WHEREAS, Carver County and the City of Hamburg entered into a Contract for Police Services for 2020 and 2021, and:

WHEREAS, the cost for policing services for 2021 was projected as \$18,203.00.

WHEREAS, the actual costs for policing services in 2021 is \$17,573.00.

WHEREAS, the Sheriff shall invoice one half of the total amount of the 2021 police staffing option costs hereunder, or \$8,786.50 to be paid on or before June 30 of the 2021 contract year. The Sheriff shall invoice the amount, or \$8,786.50 to be paid on or before November 30 of the 2021 contract year.

WHEREAS, in this Amendment and to be incorporated under ARTICLE VI in successor police contracts, if either party terminates this agreement or elects to discontinue contracted services, or in any way decrease contracted police services, the City shall still be obligated to pay all unpaid personnel costs as determined by the County. The total unpaid costs shall not exceed 5% of the total cost for police services excluding unpaid overtime.

WHEREAS, under ARTICLE VII of the policing contract, if the City requests coverage for compensated days off as defined under 1.1.1 of Police Staffing Options, additional hours for deputies will be billed at \$68.42 for the contract year 2021.

WHEREAS, in this Amendment and to be incorporated under ARTICLE VII of successor police contracts, the County, upon receiving continuing education reimbursement, shall reimburse the city pursuant to the MN Administrative Rules, Peace Officer Standards and Training Board, Chapter 6700, part 6700.1800:

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED that the above terms and conditions be in effect and the amended cost of the Contract for Policing for 2021 is \$17,573.00 and:

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that all other terms and conditions of this contract remain in effect as per the original contract.
