RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING OFF-PREMISES LIQUOR SERVICE AT COMMUNITY FESTIVAL

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes, section 340A.404, subdivision 4(b), authorizes a City Council to authorize a liquor license holder to serve liquor at an off-premises location at a community festival;

WHEREAS, the Big Rib Jig, held on June 22, 2019, is an important attraction for the community and takes place within the City of Hamburg;

WHEREAS, Parkside Tavern has an active retail intoxicating on-sale liquor license issued by the City of Hamburg;

WHEREAS, Parkside Tavern desires to dispense liquor outside of its licensed premises during the Big Rib Jig; and

WHEREAS, Parkside Tavern has provided the City of Hamburg with proof of liability insurance in compliance with Minnesota Statutes, section 340A.409; therefore

BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF HAMBURG, MINNESOTA:

- 1. The Big Rib Jig, held on June 22, 2019, is a community festival.
- 2. Parkside Tavern is hereby authorized to dispense liquor off premises during the Big Rib Jig on June 22, 2019, in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, section 340A.404, subdivision 4(b).
- Parkside Tavern may only dispense liquor in the designated areas of the Big Rib Jig. The designated areas are exclusively Bicentennial Park (614 Park Avenue) and the fenced-in area of Railroad Street immediately adjacent to Parkside Tavern. All liquor must be consumed in the designated areas.
- 4. Parkside Tavern is responsible for ensuring no persons under the age of 21 obtain or consume alcohol at the Big Rib Jig.





I am sending this letter to remind you of the terms of the Conditional Use Permit (CUP) that were granted on March 13, 2007, for the temporary storage container on your property.

One of the conditions of the CUP is the storage container is temporary and can only be used for the current business (Timberline Wood Products), so as soon as you cease operation at this location the CUP is no longer valid. The storage container must be removed when the business moves and/or sells. Please see the attached copy of the CUP for reference.

The City was informed at the November 13, 2018 Council Meeting that the property at 400 Railroad Street was sold to Triple T Services. Since you no longer operate at this address and have sold this property the CUP is no longer valid and the storage container must be removed immediately. If the storage container is not removed the City may seek legal action to remove the container.

TODD RAPP, RAPP STRATEGIES

- Democrats lost 2 U.S. Senate seats and 35-37 house seats but added over 300 legislative seats. Democrats flipped 7 governors.
- The results were typical for a midterm election where the sitting president has an approval rating below 50%.
- A survey yielded unusual results indicating that a quarter of Americans think the economy is doing well yet also think the country is going in the wrong direction. Many of these respondents live in the suburbs.
- The 2018 midterm elections saw the highest midterm voter turnout in MN history with 2,615,092 voters. The primary driver was younger voters.
- Tim Walz is the first governor from Greater MN in 32 years.
- MN has the only split legislature in the country.
- MN now has 4 major parties (Democratic Farmer Laborer, Republican Party of MN, Grassroots-Legalize Cannabis Party, Legal Marijuana Now Party).
- Political geography is changing: more populous counties vote more democratic.
- The entire metro area in 2018 voted democratic. The suburbs and the urban core controlled this election. Suburban and urban districts are voting more democratic, rural districts are voting more republican a trend that will likely continue.
- Rural MN is likely to lose some seats in the redistricting.
- Places where population is growing faster than the state average will have more control after the legislative redistricting (Moorhead, Rochester, Bloomington, Brooklyn Park, Edina).
- Minnesota statewide political results reflect the intensifying national divisions, both geographic and ethnic.
