Staff recommends the City Council approve proposed zoning classification changes of eighteen (18) parcels throughout the City of Hamburg.





A RESOLUTION AMENDING THE ZONING DISTRICT FOR EIGHTEEN PROPERTIES WITHIN THE CITY OF HAMBURG

WHEREAS, the Zoning Ordinance provides guidance to the City of Hamburg, and

WHEREAS, rezoning of the eighteen properties is required to create an Official Zoning Map that aligns with the visions, goals, and desired policies for property within the City of Hamburg, and

WHEREAS, the City of Hamburg has scheduled a public hearing and properly noticed the zoning changes.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Parcels 45.0500190, 45.0500150, 45.0500070, 45.0283800, and 45.0331320 shall be zoned as Single Family (R-1).

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Parcels 45.0500050, 45.0500020, 45.2000010, 45.2000020, 45.1770010, 45.1770020, 45.1770030, and 45.1770040 shall be zoned as Multiple Family (R-2).

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Parcels 45.0282010, 45.9990100, 45.5000090, and 45.0281401 shall be zoned as Restricted Agricultural (A-1)

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED, that Parcel 45.0280205 shall be zoned as General Industrial (I).

THEREFORE, BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED, that the updated Official Zoning Map is adopted and is effective as of the date of this resolution.

Dear Legislator:

I am writing to urge your support for legislation that provides a \$20 million grant to Carver County for important safety and mobility improvements to Trunk Highway 5.

Carver County and local partners recently completed the Arboretum Area Transportation Plan which identifies the Highway 5 Mobility project as part of the long-range vision for planning for significant growth within the Twin Cities Metropolitan Area.

Highway 5 provides access to the Minnesota Landscape Arboretum - a nationwide destination for 500,000 annual visitors with growth plans expected to attract an additional 100,000 visitors per year. In addition, Highway 5 serves as a major freight and commuter corridor. The Highway 5 Mobility Project allows the Arboretum and the Cities of Chanhassen, Chaska, Victoria, and Carver County to realize their full growth potential for jobs and housing.

The project will include roadway expansion to 4 lanes, a 1,900 ft long bridge to elevate the roadway and reconnect Lake Minnewashta, a pedestrian underpass under Highway 5 to connect to the Regional Trail and capacity improvements at the Highway 5 and Highway 41 intersection.

Today, Highway 5 is traveled by 7,000 vehicles (800 heavy commercial) a day, experienced 65 crashes from 2014-2018 (3x state average) and will see 180,000+ hours/year peak period delay by 2040. Today there are often 2 mile backups on Highway 5 due to congestion. The Highway 5 Mobility project will reduce delays and improve safety in this heavily traveled and important corridor for the region.

I am writing to urge you to support legislation (SF3918/HF4170) which provides \$20 million for a grant to Carver County to complete the preliminary engineering, environmental documentation, final design, right-of-way acquisition, and construction of improvements to marked Trunk Highway 5 from Minnewashta Parkway to marked Trunk Highway 41 in the city of Chanhassen. This bill will fund the mainline highway expansion, cross streets, off-street trails, a bridge over Lake Minnewashta wetlands, utility relocations, and installations.

Thank you for your consideration of this important capital project for inclusion in this year's capital budget bill.





A customer can qualify through multiple methods, such as household income, being a participant in certain government programs such as SNAP, Medicaid, WIC or others, or if the resident or a child of the resident receives a Lifeline benefit.

If a resident qualifies, they can register for the program by contacting the FCC or directly with Mediacom by visiting www.mediacomcable.com/acp. On our site, the customer can fill out an application to qualify, enroll in the program, and choose a level of service that best fits their needs seamlessly.

We also have launched our Connect2Compete+ program, which is a \$30/month internet service that offers 50 Mbps download, 5 Mbps upload speeds with free installation and equipment for qualifying customers. RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING OFF-PREMISES LIQUOR SERVICE AT COMMUNITY FESTIVAL ON SEPTEMBER 24, 2022

WHEREAS, Minnesota Statutes, section 340A.404, subdivision 4(b), authorizes a City Council to authorize a liquor license holder to serve liquor at an off-premises location at a community festival;

WHEREAS, the Big Rib Jig, being held on September 24, 2022, is an important attraction for the community and takes place within the City of Hamburg;

WHEREAS, Parkside Tavern has an active retail intoxicating on-sale liquor license issued by the City of Hamburg;

WHEREAS, Parkside Tavern desires to dispense liquor outside of its licensed premises during the Big Rib Jig; and

WHEREAS, Parkside Tavern has provided the City of Hamburg with proof of liability insurance in compliance with Minnesota Statutes, section 340A.409;

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE CITY COUNCIL OF HAMBURG, MINNESOTA:

- The Big Rib Jig, being held on September 24, 2022, is a community festival.
- 2. Organizers are required to follow all federal, state, and local requirements and guidelines related to COVID-19, and responsible for requiring the same compliance from attendees at their events.
- Parkside Tavern is hereby authorized to dispense liquor off premises during the Big Rib Jig on September 24, 2022, in accordance with Minnesota Statutes, section 340A.404, subdivision 4(b).
- 4. Parkside Tavern may only dispense liquor in the designated areas of the Big Rib Jig. The designated areas are exclusively Bicentennial Park (614 Park Avenue) and the fenced-in area of Railroad Street immediately adjacent to Parkside Tavern. All liquor must be consumed in the designated areas.
- 5. Parkside Tavern is responsible for ensuring no persons under the age of 21 obtain or consume alcohol at the Big Rib Jig.

Jeremy,

Sorry for the delay in getting back to you. I looked through the code and it doesn't say that you couldn't combine two properties, but I am worried about the idea of combining two parcels that don't share a property line. I think there needs to be a fine line between combining parcels across ROW (alley only? Alley and street?) and combining parcels across the city. I think there are two real options:

1. You don't allow properties to be combined when divided by ROW (unless their property lines touch underneath ROW). – My recommendation.

This makes sense from one viewpoint- you can't actually combine parcels when they are divided by ROW that is owned by the City. Perhaps this could be different if the parcels "owned" underneath the ROW and touched each other, but in both cases I don't think that applies. The plats for both subdivisions very clearly dedicated ROW and defined the parcel boundaries.

2. You allow properties that are directly adjacent to each other across ROW to be combined.

The situation I saw in Eyota was an existing non-conformity, so it doesn't exactly apply, but they had an alley that divided the property between a principal structure and a garage. Eventually they decided they wanted to make it into two parcels again, which makes me hesitate recommending this for Hamburg. Say you combine them and an accessory structure is built, what method do you have of making sure the garage is torn down or moved if that property owner wishes to sell either part of the combined parcel? It makes the process messier. If you do decide to move forward with this, I recommend only allowing parcels that are directly across from each other via alley ROW to be combined. You could also include streets, but I think there is a difference between properties across alleys and streets in terms of continuity between both parts of the parcel.
