Dear Mr. O'Reilly:

Following up on our previous telephone conversations regarding the fact that the City of Hamburg has storm sewer lines on property that is now owned by Jake B. Trebesch's Triple T Services, LLC, please be advised that my client has now determined that there are actually more than one storm sewer line in each of the two manholes that are located on the property that was purchased by the Trebesch family from the Regional Railroad last year. In view of the numerous storm sewer lines—as well as the location of those lines on the southwestern portion of the property that the Trebesch family purchased from the Regional Rail Authority—my client is proposing to sell the entire area of that property that is located southwesterly of the northern manhole to the City (for your convenience, I am attaching a copy of the Carver County GIS that apparently the City has provided, with a green line designating the approximate location of the northeasterly line of the parcel that Triple T Services, LLC proposes to sell to the City of Hamburg). According to the information provided by the City, my client would be selling approximately 0.4/10ths of an acre to the City. My client proposes to sell that parcel to the City for a one-time payment of \$150,000.

With respect to the existing sewer line on the remaining portions of my client's property, it proposes to enter into a perpetual easement with the City of Hamburg (which will run with the land), whereby the City pays an annual rental fee of \$1,000 per year to my client, and forgives all storm sewer usage charges to any of the properties in the City of Hamburg that are owned by my client or the Trebesch family.

Parceling off the approximate 0.4/10ths of an acre to be sold to the City of Hamburg will, of course, require a survey, the cost of which should be borne by the City. In addition, Mr. Trebesch is requesting that the City reimburse Triple T Services, LLC for my fees and expenses, which are currently approximately \$1,500.00.

I understand that this matter has been pending for some time, and my client is now intent upon bringing it to a head. Accordingly, if we cannot reach a satisfactory resolution of this matter with the City of Hamburg by August 15, 2018, we will have no choice but to commence a lawsuit against the City of Hamburg for inverse condemnation, pursuant to which we will seek reimbursement of attorney's fees and other litigation costs, as well as my client's "just compensation" for the uncompensated taking.



Dear Mr. Neaton,

The City Council of the City of Hamburg ("City") considered the offer dated July 10, 2018, from Triple T Services, LLC ("Triple T"), at the City Council meeting on July 10, 2018. The City Council voted to reject Triple T's offer.

While the City rejected the offer, it must be noted that the City cannot agree to forgive certain storm sewer usage charges for any properties owned by other Trebesch family members. Specifically, the City cannot waive storm sewer usage charges for any property owned by Councilmember Steve Trebesch. Including such a provision in an agreement with Triple T would violate Minnesota Statutes, section 471.87, because Councilmember Trebesch would have a personal financial interest in the agreement.


As a counteroffer, the City offers Triple T \$28,240 as a one-time payment to purchase the entirety of the parcel at issue (PID: 110282010). The City requests a response to this offer by July 27, 2018, to enable the City Council to discuss Triple T's response at its next meeting on July 31, 2018.

These are the actual quotes that Lois received on the construction of the pond and storm sewer. There are two pages in the pdf.

Muellers is digging the pond. Schneider is installing the pipe (both the storm sewer which empties into the pond, and the outleting pipe from the pond)

Costs are as follows:

Storm Sewer: \$32,433.50 Pond Construction: \$35,438.50 Pond Outlet Pipe: \$18,200

Total: \$86,072

As we discussed on the phone, the meeting minutes that I took were as follows:

- Intitial discussion and consideration was related to the city considering covering the cost of just the storm sewer costs: \$32,433.50.
- However the direction at the end of the meeting from Mayor and Council was to at least look at all of the costs associated with stormwater management, pond and piping: \$86,072.
- No final decision was made regarding what costs or if any costs would be covered by the city. But staff to research the budget impact of covering all or a portion of the above mentioned costs.
- Council will make a determination at next meeting regarding what level of costs would be covered and what funding sources could potentially be used to cover those costs.
- There was some discussion about a multi-year payback. That would need to be outlined in a developers agreement if this
 was even a possibility. City Attorney question.
- There was some questions regarding grant oppportunities. The discussion at the meeting was that grants for storm water management improvements that are a result of new construction are not available.
- Can annexation be completed on a parallel track, since Lois owns all the property? City attorney to research.
- Can city attorney prepare developers agreement, what provisions should be in the agreement? City attorney to research.

952 new area code The City Council requested that I send you this letter outlining the responsibilities and requirements that are needed for the City's review of your development proposal.

First, several sequential steps are required before development (assuming sewer capacity exists) can begin on the Droege property. These steps include:

- 1. Annexation of the property to the City
- 2. Approval of a Comprehensive Plan amendment for the annexed property by the Metropolitan Council and the City.
- 3. Preliminary Plat approval in accordance with the City's Subdivision Ordinance.
- 4. Final Plat approval.

Annexation

The City Council indicated that consideration would be given to a request for annexation by ordinance of the property. However, before this can occur, a petition must be submitted to the City by the landowner requesting that the City annex the property. After the City receives the petition from the landowner (and assuming acceptance by the Council), the City will initiate the steps for annexation that includes notice to Young America Township and property owners, a public hearing and the preparation of an ordinance and other materials by the City Attorney.

Comprehensive Plan Amendment

Assuming the annexation ordinance is filed with the state and other jurisdictions, the City will initiate an amendment to the Comprehensive Plan for the annexation area. A public hearing before the Planning Commission and approval by the City

Council is necessary before the Metropolitan Council can consider the

Comprehensive Plan amendment. It is anticipated that the review by the Metropolitan Council will take 60 days.

Subdivision Review

You will need to follow the procedure for plat review required by the Subdivision Ordinance. First, a sketch plan containing information required by section 5-304 (a) of the Subdivision Ordinance will need to be submitted to the City for review by the Planning Commission. Next, a preliminary plat and supporting data consisting of the items listed in section 5-305 of the Subdivision Ordinance will need to be submitted to the City.

The preliminary plat titled "Hamburg's Fourth Addition", dated October 2003, that was denied by the City Council late last year did not contain sufficient information. It would be advisable to meet with City consultants and staff before you submit the preliminary plat information to ensure that you have an understanding of all City requirements.

The following items (as discussed at the April 13, 2004 City Council meeting) should be addressed at the time of preliminary plat review:

- 1. Roadway extensions are needed on the north and east sides of the development to allow for future development of adjoining property, and to plan for another street outlet for the entire neighborhood to CSAH 50 or CSAH 31.
- 2. A sketch should be prepared of how development on adjacent properties can occur with the proposed development scheme as allowed by the Subdivision Ordinance. This plan and does not need to be as detailed as the scheme submitted for the Fourth Addition.
- 3. Confirmation that available sewer capacity exists for the new subdivision (to be completed by the City).
- 4. Submittal of a detailed utility plan that includes the location, sizing and elevations of sewer and water lines, and other utilities within the development. Consideration should be given to the need to "loop" the water lines and maintain gravity sewer from an overall City perspective.
- 5. A detailed grading and storm water drainage plan that takes into consideration area-wide drainage including that from the Second and Third Addition should be submitted for City review. The plan should meet the requirements of the Carver County Water Management Plan and rules.
- 6. Submission of the wetland delineation and County review of low area on Lots 1-4, Block 4. (SEH information)
- 7. Submittal of detailed street plans.
- 8. The purpose of Outlots A and B should be defined.
- 9. The ultimate disposition of Lots 1-4, Block 4 should be shown.

- 10. The value of land to be dedicated for Park Dedication purposes.
- 11. A general overview of the characteristics of housing (sample elevations, floor plans, exterior materials, etc.) to be built on the lots.

In addition, the plans for preliminary plat review should meet all of the requirements of the City's Subdivision Ordinance.

Development Agreement

After the preliminary plat has been approved by the City Council, your company will be required to enter a Development Agreement with the City. The Development Agreement will include the provisions of the 2nd and 3rd Addition Development Agreement and as well as the following provisions:

- 1. Any stipulations of approval placed upon the preliminary plat approval by the City Council.
- 2. A requirement that Final Plat approval of all or a portion of the preliminary plat may be withheld if sanitary sewer capacity is not available.
- 3. Developers responsibilities for any or all public and private subdivision improvements.
- 4. Landscaping, sodding/seeding and driveway materials and installation requirements.
- 5. City responsibilities for any public improvements.
- 6. Timeline for development of property.
- 7. Construction requirements such as street sweeping, erosion and sedimentation control and sewer cleaning.
- 8. Agreement to pay fee for City administration/review of improvements and engineering inspections within subdivision.
- 9. Agreement to escrow funds or letter of credit for public improvements and landscaping installed by developer.
- 10. Removal of any hazardous waste materials and contaminated soil and ground water on the property as required by the MN Pollution Control Agency. Proof of compliance with agency requirements prior to issuance of any certificates of occupancy.
- 11. The Development Agreement will need to be recorded with Carver County before issuance of building permits.

Further discussion regarding the contents of the Development Agreement can be discussed after the preliminary plat has been approved by the City Council.

Developer Reimbursement

The City will incur costs for the preparation of the annexation request, the Comprehensive Plan amendment and the review of the subdivision request. The

City Council has directed that Rosemount Development pay for all of the costs the City incurs to review your development proposal. You will need to escrow money with the City for consultant review fees and sign an agreement that assigns responsibility for paying any costs over the initial escrow amount.

Also, the City will require that the developers pay for studies (such as the area stormwater management) or the review of studies (conducted by your consultants) that may be required due to the development of the property. The scope of studies that are needed is an item that should be discussed when you meet with consultants to discuss the preliminary plat.

The escrow should be submitted at the time the petition for annexation is submitted. The City will be determining the amount of money that should be escrowed over the next several weeks.
